Is marijuana addictive?

Pennsylvania State Representative **Jordan Harris** (D-Philadelphia), a proponent of marijuana commercialization, has claimed that marijuana is "not addictive."

Mainstream science and medical organizations all agree that marijuana has addictive qualities.

- "Marijuana is addictive. Research shows that one-in-six people who start using the drug before
 the age of 18 can become addicted." (One-in-ten adults who use the drug can become addicted.)
